**Update from Catholic Charities:** As of June 6, 2007, our Diocese has pledged of \$2.6 million dollars for the *2007 Appeal for Catholic Charities and Church*. That is 72% of the goal of \$3.6 million.

**St. Frances Cabrini Parish** has received \$10,796 in pledges, which is 55% of our goal of \$19,730.65.

**St. Mary Parish** has received \$9,947.50 in pledges, which is 42% of our goal of \$23,541.41.
