Stewardship “The harvest is abundant,” Jesus tells the seventy-two in today’s Gospel, “but the laborers are few.” The situation is the same today. How can *I* help with God’s harvest? Am *I* one who could provide food, shelter or wages to those who toil in the fields of the Lord?

This weekend we welcome **Rev. Raju Pilla** who will be speaking to us about the works and needs of his Mission Diocese in India. The Latin Archdiocese of Trivandrum has about 300,000 Catholics. 90% of them are traditional fishermen who solely depend on fishing for their livelihood and 10% of them are farm workers who are recent converts from low caste Hindus. **“The Harvest is plentiful but laborers are few!”** Unemployment and poverty are most rampant in this community. The Archdiocese depends on outside assistance to support its clergy, seminarians and Catechists to continue its Spiritual, Educational and Economic developmental programs for this community. Thank you in advance for your generosity in this weekend’s second collection!

An **“All Saints Pilgrimage”** to Italy led by Fr. Thomas is being planned for November 1 – 12, 2010 visiting the shrines, basilicas and churches of San Antonio, *Padua*, San Marco, *Venice*; San Vitale, *Ravenna*; San Rufino (Basilica of St. Francis) and Santa Clare, *Assisi*; Basilica di Santa Maria del Fiori (St. Mary of the Flowers, Duomo) and Santa Croce, *Florence*; Santa Maria Assunta, *Orvieto*; San Pietro, San Giovanni Laterano and Santa Maria Maggiore, *Rome* and other sites. 7 of 17 reservations are still open.
