Monday, January 9 we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which begins *National Vocation Awareness Week*, a special time in which the Church prays for the renewal and strengthening of vocations of dedicated people as married and single people, men to serve as priests, deacons, brothers and women as religious sisters. The annual **Week of Prayer for Christian Unity** begins in one week, on Wed, Jan 18, and continues through Tues, Jan 25. The theme for 2012 is "We Will All Be Changed by the Victory of Our Lord Jesus Christ." Therefore, beginning in January, 2012, there will be multiple Mass intentions for the weekend Masses. Single Mass intentions will be used for weekday Masses.
